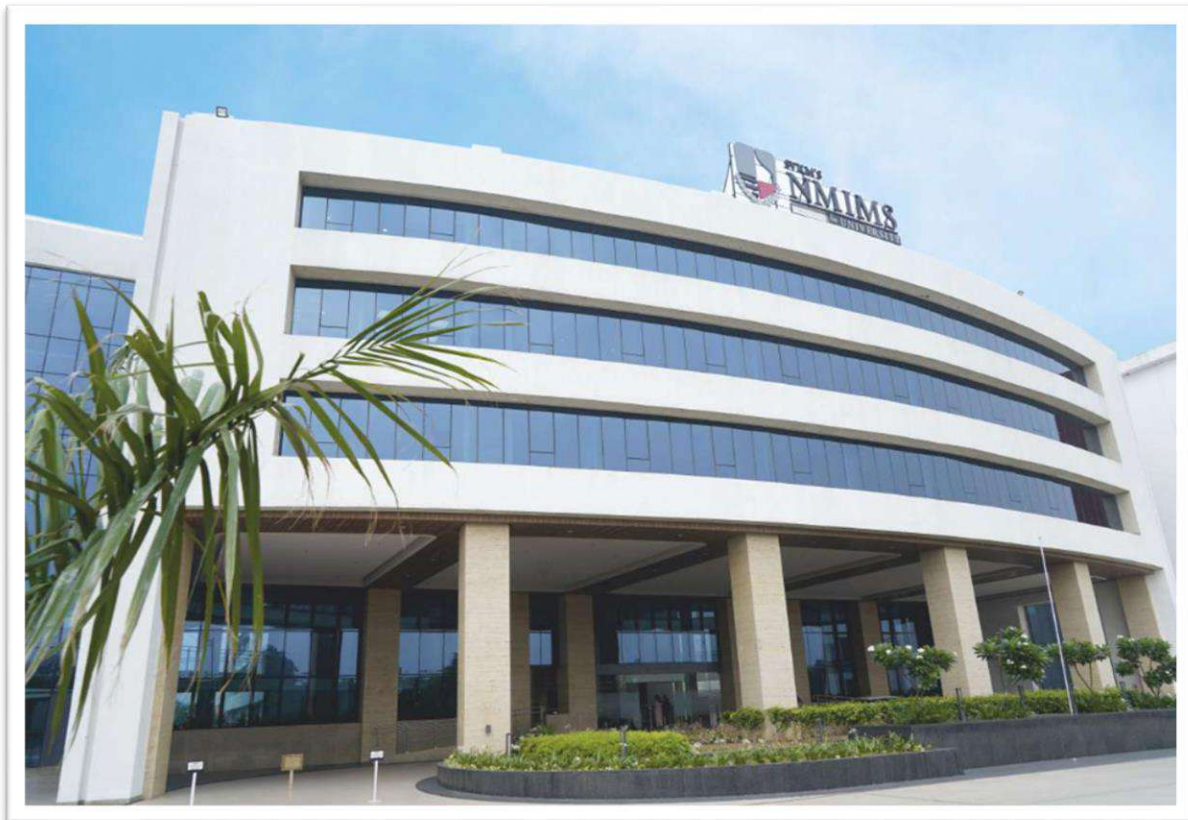

Guest Talk: From Insights to Impact: Power of Marketing & Marketing Research

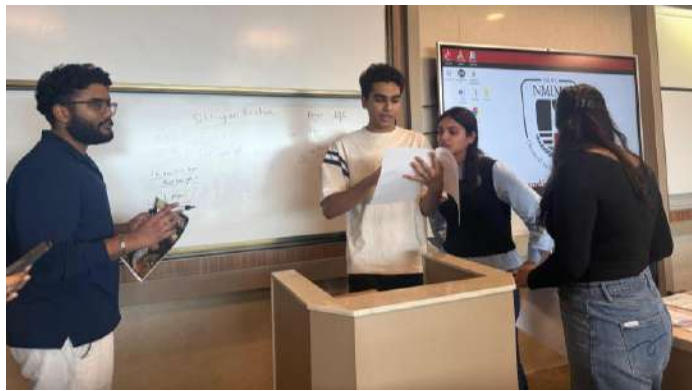
